Some of you will have already met the Rev Ian Wilson, our new Chaplain, responsible for among other things, a multi-parish benefice based at Nacton. MU is very close to his heart, he wears his badge, and at all his weddings and baptisms is proud to wear his MU stole. What a blessing to us he is! For my part, I have been delighted to attend Diocesan Synod, MSH Conferences, training days, seminars and meetings, but have also very much enjoyed visiting our branches (including wonderful strawberry teas!), and sharing in deanery events and activities.... What is “your thing”? - how do you promote MU where you live?

Our finances are in a healthy state, and we have been able to substantially support the initial preliminary emergency appeal for Lake Malawi (our linked diocese). As friends and loved ones move on, new members are joining our branches/diocese via the internet, MSH website, Facebook or personal invitation. Congratulations to all those who have engaged with this and are finding the courage and confidence to talk to their family, friends and neighbours about their faith.

Putting faith into action is part our Diocesan Triennium Strategy - **A,B,C** – (**A**FIA [Away From It All], **B**efriending and the **C**lewer initiative). The Mothers' Union theme is Listening, Observing and Acting - in step with God. All Trustees have been working hard speaking at branch, deanery, area meetings and synods and organising events; processing grant applications for AFIA (Val); ordering, admin. and selling MUE products (Clare and Penny); editing and distributing Pathways (Viv); sending out cards and letters to Indoor Members, and 90+ birthdays, celebrating anniversaries and other important occasions (Monica and Margaret); organising the Diocesan Members with card making for Prisoners (Sue) and preparing the Wave of Prayer Service booklets (Janice). Last, but by no means least, encouraging our members to pray with and for one another, be it through the Emergency Prayer Chain (Jean), in prayer meetings, the small prayer cells in our front rooms, or on our own "in our closet". God is listening!

We thank the Trustees and Officers on your behalf for all they have done and achieved these last six months. Finally, our thanks to Beryl our secretary, who has held it all together for us. It is a real privilege to head up this team - it's exciting to be able to carry on building on the firm foundation others have laid - the workload is becoming manageable, the prayer support tangible, the friendship and fellowship delightful, the blessings enormous, but the rewards immense! Thank you to everyone for making our MU such a success.

BRANCH DONATIONS 2018

Thank you for submitting your annual branch returns for 2018, which have been essential in compiling the following totals of the donations that you have made during the year.

Knitted hats for Seaman's Mission and Maternity Units.

Twenty four branches knitted in excess of 1496 seafarer's hats, some branches had not recorded numbers.

There were 696 baby hats knitted from 16 branches including several with no numbers given. In addition, 30 plus cardigans, 42 baby quilts/blankets and some baby socks and mitts were donated.

Donations to 2 Women's Refuges.

Many of you have sent toiletries but these have been difficult to quantify as some branches stated numbers of items and others, numbers of 'bagfulls'. However, 23 branches provided very considerably to this appeal and some branches also provided fabric bags with their donations. Toiletries were also sent to the hospital in Ipswich.

At Christmas branches gave gift tokens and sent toys and gifts.

Other items have included linen, knickers and socks.

There were boxes sent for 'Link of Hope' and Seafarers, plus cakes made for bereavement services.

There was a most generous response for the Night shelter which ran over the winter. It is impossible to quantify this, but anyone who saw the 'room' stacked with donations at St Mary Stoke last autumn should feel proud to be an MU member.

The information provided, also shows a wide range of support for projects local to individual branches including 'Basic Life', Food Banks, IWNS, Find and others.

Thank you for collecting this information and whatever your branch donates 'well done', together we have and do make a difference. Please continue to note your donations during the year and send a breakdown with you branch report next year.
